Pupils will then explore expanded explanation writing, with cross curriculum links to their science and geography topics.

Guided Reading: Black and British by David Olusoga

Multiplication and Division

Pupils will develop skills in:

Short division and division with remainders.

Geography

What is a river?

Pupils will begin by exploring the physical features of rivers and our location on the estuary. They will investigate rivers around the world and the impact human geography has had on them.

Design Technology

Digital World - Monitoring devices

Pupils will begin by observing an everyday device (thermometer) and then research and design their own.

Pupils will progress through making physical and virtual models using software programming.

Computing

Data and Information - Flat-file Databases

Pupils will use tools within a database to order and answer questions., create graphs and charts to help solve problems, and present their work to peers.

Pupils will explore a cappella singing, and ensemble percussion performances. They will observe traditional performances, recall a variety of sounds and build up accompaniments by playing beats on percussion instruments.
