Class Novel: Charlotte's Web by E B White

Unit 1-The Minpins by Roald Dahl-writing setting descriptions, writing character descriptions, using adjectives, conjunctions, noun phrases and adverbs. Planning, writing and editing a story based on the book.

Unit 2-The Owl and The Pussycat by Edward Lear-exploring the theme of the poem, writing in role as the characters, learning the poem to perform, writing a story of the further adventures of the owl and the pussycat.

Phonics and reading

- Daily phonics lesson
- X3 reading practise sessions per week (for children on Little Wandle reading books)
- X1 opportunity to select a Reading for Pleasure book
- X1 visit to the school library

Maths

Length and height-measuring in cm and metres. Comparing and ordering lengths and heights. Solving problems involving lengths and heights.

Mass, capacity and temperature-measuring mass in g and kg. Solving problems involving mass. Comparing volume and capacity. Measuring in ml and l. Solving problems involving volume and capacity. Measuring and comparing temperature.

Fractions-recognising halves, quarters, three-quarters and thirds. Recognising equivalent fractions.

Science

Uses of everyday materials-describing properties of materials, describing changes in materials.

RE

How do symbols help us to understand the Easter story? Understanding that symbols have a deeper meaning and a story to tell. Developing knowledge of the Easter story. Understanding the importance of Easter and the concept of salvation.
