

## English

### *Reading*

Class Novel: continue Millions by Frank Cottrell Boyce.

### *Guided Reading*

When The Stars Come Out by Nicola Edwards.

Pupils will: focus on retrieval skills and identifying and explaining content and language choices, develop summarising skills.

### *Writing*

#### **The Whale by Ethan and Vita Murrow**

Writing opportunities include reported speech and thoughts, descriptions, recounting events in role, letters and film pitches. Pupils will explore an illustrative book and use inference skills to develop their writing.

#### **The Lost Happy Endings by Carol Ann Duffy**

Writing opportunities include letters, poetry, direct speech and story writing.

Pupils will further their understanding of perspective and use creative writing to explore a prequel to the story.

## Maths

### *Fractions*

Calculating fractions of quantity, amounts and wholes and using fraction for operations.

### *Decimals and Percentages*

Calculation decimals to the thousandths, comparing and ordering decimals, understanding place value of decimals, calculating percentages as decimals and fractions.

### *Perimeter and Area*

Calculating the perimeter and area of a variety of shapes and using estimations.

## Science

### *Forces*

Exploration of the effects gravity and resistance has, how to accurately measure force, use scientific reasoning and experimentation to explain and present results.

## RE

*Why do Christians believe that Easter is a celebration of victory?*

Pupils will explore the Easter story and discuss and develop their understanding of the impact it has on Christians today.

### *Sculpture and 3D Interactive Instillation*

Communicating a message through art, how life experiences can inspire art and investigate scale, location and interactive elements of instillations.

## Computing

### *Creating Media – Vector Graphics*

Creating media images using vector drawings programmes, investigate manipulating, positioning and layering objects and drawings, represent light and shade and proportions.

## Music

### *Compositions for the festival of colour: Holi*

Creating music by considering pitch and tempo of sound, individual human timbre and musical notation and group performance. (Links to Christian celebrations of Easter)

### *Tennis*

Develop skills in tennis ‘shots’, accuracy and tactics of net games, match rules and scoring.

### *Active Orienteering*

Team building, problem solving following and giving concise instructions, encouragement of others and utilising their strengths.

### *Health and Wellbeing*

Develop an understanding of everyday drugs and their effect on health and wellbeing, discuss the drug laws and support available.
