

Snippets from the classrooms

Reception - For part of Science week we have been learning to be 'Space Explorers' and have made telescopes to look at the stars. In Maths we have been building towers of different heights and measuring and sorting objects according to their length. On Thursday we have dressed up and acted out the 'Last Supper' and 'The Great Parade' as part of our RE. The rest of the school were most surprised to find us parading through the school!

In Design and Technology, Year 1 have started an exciting new unit of work - Puppets! We began by learning how to attach two pieces of material together using three different

techniques (staple, glue and safety pin). This week, we designed our puppets and next week we will start making them. Year 1 have also been working so hard in their phonics lessons recently! We have been learning lots of new tricky sounds! Miss Harter saw some of our lesson on Wednesday and she was very impressed!

This week in English we finished writing our stories based on the Minpins. We worked hard to use lots of adjectives and similes to create atmosphere just like Roald Dahl did in the original story. We really enjoyed our Science work as part of Science week. We found out all about astronautical engineering and had a go at being engineers. We made balloon rockets and parachutes. In DT we completed and evaluated our moving monsters. We are very proud of our finished designs.

In Year 3, we are enjoying learning about branching databases in Computing. We are very good at thinking of questions with Yes/No answers in order to sort, and this week we used these skills to create our own branched databases online. This will really help us to classify in Science when we reach Year 4! We are learning a lot from our guided reading text, Africa, and we have been using Google Maps to support our learning about how diverse the countries of Africa are in landscape, temperature and people. Ask us what the presence of tropical fish in Lake Malawi teaches us about where Malawi is! We have also been getting creative in PE with our Creative Games unit. So far, we have behaved like Ghostbusters, defeated dragons and levelled-up our challenges as we have perfected our aiming and dodging skill

This week in Year 4, the children have produced some excellent tourist brochures linked to our 'Baker by the Sea' book. They have been working hard to include their writing targets and explore the grammar techniques we have been learning about. Everyone has also put so much effort into their fraction lessons, I have been so proud of the progress they have made. We have been making the most of our new reading area and the children have been enjoying their reading for pleasure time.

Science week has been very exciting, with great STEM club activities. We loved learning about engineering and its roll in space exploration. Year Six have been having early morning boosters this week in preparation for their SAT's in May. We are always so impressed by their enthusiasm to learn. In History we have been exploring aspects of Ancient Greece. The children have been investigating areas which particularly interest them.

British Science Week

We have enjoyed a wonderful British Science Week in school, with a number of 'Time' themed activities. All members of STEM Club kicked-off the week with a trip down Memory Lane, recalling their favourite Science lessons, trips and visitors over their years at our school. All classes have also taken part in a Memory Lane activity with their teacher. As a school, we considered how important time is to scientists in their daily work. Every year group has also enjoyed an interactive Inventors and Makers session in class during the week. Nursery and Reception children have become Space Explorers and created their own star gazers; Years 1 and 2 have travelled through space and time and created balloon rockets and parachutes; Years 3-6 have been on mankind's cosmic engineering journey and built landing and roving equipment. What a week!

STEM Club are taking part in the BBC's Playground Survey. As part of this, the children will be programming MicroBits to measure temperature so that they can measure the temperature of different areas of our school at different times of day. We will then upload our results to be included in the data collected nationally.

All children are invited to take part in the British Science Week poster competition which was shared on School Story on Monday. Entries should be handed into Mrs Patterson by Monday 25th March.

Step into Quality Out of School Clubs

We have been approached by the Local Authority as only two schools in the whole of Lancashire to trial a new Quality Mark for our Out of School Club provision. Our input and evaluation will then inform future assessments of other settings. We are thrilled to have been asked to take part in this! We will keep you updated with our progress.
