Outcome: Narrative based on a model text, with an innovated plot structure. Our short writing opportunities may include: diary entries, character profiles, dialogue exchange and book reviews in addition to magazine articles.

Guided Reading: Based on 'Wonder by RJ Palacio. Carousel activities and questions, based on inference and retrieval.

Spelling: Statutory KS2 spellings.

Comprehension skills taught within Guided reading and in morning tasks.

Maths:

Number - Place Value

Read, write, order and compare numbers up to ten millions.

Round whole numbers.

Use negative numbers in context.

Number – Four Operations

Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems.

Multiply and divide four digit numbers by two digit numbers.

Identify common factors and multiples.

Number – Fractions

Simplify fractions, compare and order fractions.

Add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions.

Number- Converting Units

Solve problems involving the calculation and conversion of units of measure, using decimal notation up to 3 decimal places where appropriate.

Science: Evolution and Inheritance.

Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the earth millions of years ago.

Explore adaptations and inheritance.

Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally, offspring vary and are not identical to their parents.
