Outcome: To create a movie trailer.

Short writing opportunities may include narrative writing, letters, diary extracts, persuasive speeches, poetry and instructions.

Carousel activities and questions based around inference and retrieval.

In addition to guided reading sessions we will also practice comprehension skills within weekly designated lessons.

Maths–Ratio:

Solve problems involving the relative sizes of two quantities where missing values can be found by using integer multiplication and division facts.

Algebra:

Use simple formulae

Generate and describe linear number sequences

Decimals:

Identify the value of each digit in numbers given to 3 decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000 giving answers up to 3 decimal places.

Science–Animals including humans and the circulatory system and effects of exercise on the body.

To identify and name parts of the circulatory system.

To describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood.

To describe the way in which nutrients and water are transported within animals.

To plan an investigation to observe pulse rate after exercise.

To understand the impact of an unhealthy lifestyle.

RE–The Eucharist and what this represents to a Christian.

Geography – Mountains

Describe and understand key aspects of physical geography, identify the world’s major mountain ranges, locate famous mountains using latitude and longitude, understand how fold mountains are formed, research famous world mountains and to investigate the climate of a mountain environment.

Art –Exploring Identity: Discover how artists use layers and juxtaposition to create artwork which explores identity. Making a layered portrait.

Computing-Variables in games.

This unit explores the concept of variables in programming through games in Scratch. First, learners find out what variables are and relate them to real-world examples of values that can be set and changed. Then they use variables to create a simulation of a scoreboard.

Music-Film music.

Exploring and identifying the characteristics of film music. Creating a composition and graphic score to perform alongside a film.
