

English

In our English lessons, we will be focusing on classic Poetry (The Spider and the Fly). The children will explore poetry develop their vocabulary and learn to identify poetic features. Our grammar focuses will be root words and suffixes. We will also be completing a unit of work based on Explanations, where the outcome will be an explanation based on a theme. Our grammar focuses will be complex sentences and perfect form of grammar.

Maths

In maths, we will be focusing on shape (Turns and angles, Right angles, Compare angles Measure and draw accurately, Horizontal and vertical, Parallel and perpendicular, Recognise and describe 2-D shapes, draw polygons, Recognise and describe 3-D shapes , Make 3-D shapes)

We will conclude the year focusing on statistics (Interpret pictograms, Draw pictograms, interpret bar charts, collect and represent data, Two- way tables)

Science – Plants

To identify the functions of flowering plants, identify what plants need to grow, and how needs vary from plant to plant., to predict and evaluate finding, to understand pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

RE – Rules

in this unit, we will learn about the important rules that guide different world faiths. We will explore how Christians and Jews follow the Ten Commandments, which were given to Moses, and how these commandments form the foundations of their societies. We will also learn about the Five Pillars of Islam, the rules set out in the Qur'an , and the 99 names Muslims use to describe God's characteristics. Additionally, we will look how Buddhists follow the teachings of the Buddha and how Sikhs show their commitment to God by wearing the Five K'. Finally, we will consider that some people choose not to follow any specific religious rules.

PE – Netball. In our PE lessons, we will be learning how to play net ball and developing the key skills needed for the game. We will also continue our striking and fielding unit, building on the techniques we have already learned

DT – Structures: Constructing a castle

In design and technology, pupils will be focusing on castles including their features and purpose. This will lead to examining the structures of a castle and the shapes within the structure. The pupils will use their knowledge of castles to then create their own castle plan, which they will use to create their own castle out of paper/card.

Computing - Programming- Events and actions in programs

This unit builds on sequencing skills and introduces links between events and actions. Learners will program a sprite to move in four directions and navigate a maze, designing an appropriately sized sprite. They will also explore pen blocks to draw and customise lines, ending the unit by design and coding their own maze-tracing program

Music – Jazz

In music, we will be learning about ragtime and jazz. We will begin by exploring what ragtime music is and learning to play “off beat” and sing in syncopated rhythms. We will practice call and response, including improvising our own responses, and have a go at scat singing using both sounds and words. We will also compose and perform jazz motif using swung quavers and play swung rhythms on tuned percussion instruments

PSHE – Being My Best

In PSHE we will be learning about healthy eating and the importance of a healthy as well as balanced diet.

French – A circle of life in French

We will be learning to use bilingual dictionary to look up English nouns, to identify the correct French noun and to notice whether it is masculine or feminine. Using these dictionary skills, the children will learn new animal vocabulary, and sort the nouns according to gender.
